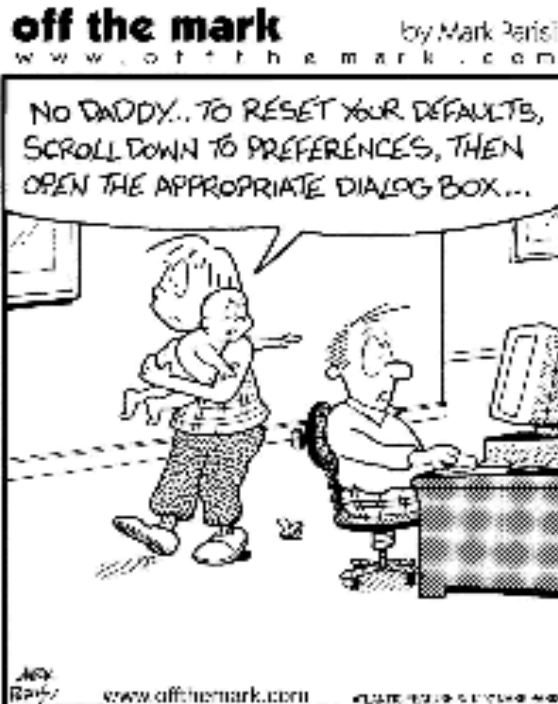

Jetstream.

Telecom introduced some new Jetstream plans at the beginning of March, which should be available through most ISP's. These provide a 256kbps download speed, and 128kbps upload. These plans all have data caps, but the excess data charges have been reduced substantially. The highest cap is 10GB per month, with no excess data charge, but your speed may be reduced if you do go over this limit.

Security.

Keep your Antivirus product up to date – there have been a few new virus's released recently. Some of you may be getting messages from strange places saying you have sent them an infected Email, when you know you haven't. If you are up to date then you shouldn't worry about this – just delete these messages. It wouldn't hurt to double check though.
